COMMUNICATION AND THE KIRKBY CHILD UPDATE



As part of the CLPE Power of Reading project across all schools in the Kirkby Collaborative, Mr Greenbank and Mr Pearson have been reading and teaching 'Wonder' by R. J. Palacio.

The classes produced some excellent work: from role-play, letters by characters and alternate book designs to #choosekind actions which young people carried out in the community, filling a jar

with marbles for every time they did something nice for others.
