Dear Parent/Carer,

As the end of 2022 approaches, may I express good wishes to each of you for the festive season. 2022 has been a very positive year for Kirkby High School, not only because we celebrated Ofsted's recognition of how GOOD the school is but we also achieved our best set of GCSE results to date. For some of us, it has also been a tough year. As you may know, I lost my own mother in August and many families in our school community were also touched by the death of a loved one. The staff and I will keep everyone who has experienced loss in our thoughts this Christmas.

At school the build up to Christmas has been lovely and our students and staff have enjoyed Christmas trees in both the atrium and reception areas and we have listened to Christmas music played through the tannoy system at lunch time each day since 12th December. This has been very pleasant and very festive.

I would like to thank the vast majority of parents and carers who support the high standards and expectations we have at Kirkby High School. All young people respond more positively when they are given clear boundaries and when all the adults in their lives are on the same page. 

Maths News




Open Evening
