

Message from the Headteacher, Mrs Dobson

Dear Parent/Carer,

I would like to thank the whole school community for the welcome that I received on starting my new role in February. I hope you enjoy reading about our celebrations and successes in this newsletter. Our mission is 'Maximising our Potential' and so it is wonderful to see all the opportunities offered to our young people.

Alongside our mission, this half-term, we have consulted with all students, parents, carers and staff to launch our new Kirkby Child values: Respect, Resilience, Aspiration, Kindness and Confidence. These values are essential to our school's vision: 'A community driven by high expectations and mutual respect providing all individuals with the belief and opportunities to succeed now and in the future'. Alongside this, we are excited to be launching our new Kirkby Child rewards system after Easter. We believe that we should celebrate and reward our Kirkby Children for displaying the values that will maximise their potential. Our students will receive rewards tickets to be stuck in their planners for displaying our Kirkby Child values. These tickets will lead to a variety of prizes ranging from certificates to gift vouchers, and even school trips, to be awarded at the end of each half term. We hope that you will check your child's planner and celebrate their successes regularly, just as we will be doing in school.

Thank you for ensuring that your child attends school each day wearing their full school uniform. In preparation for the return after Easter, I would like to reinforce our high expectations linked to uniform.

As part of our uniform expectations:

Year 8 News




It has been a busy term for Year 8.
